The wines made in 2016 have been extremely elegant with complexity that may rival any previous vintage in Oregon. The Westmount Pinot Gris in 2016 is a perfect example of the multiple layers you peel back when drinking the wine. It is crisp with excellent floral and citrus notes. It's dry but with a smooth finish that comes through with honeydew sweet notes. It's a great wine for a summer day and to any Pinot Gris novice, a fair expression of the intricateness that the varietal can display.



### **2015 Pinot Noir Willamette Valley**

The 2015 vintage was Westmount's first and was propelled by an ideally warm and dry growing season. As a result, the fruit yielded off Westmount vineyard is big and bold and is a fitting way of telling people you have arrived. Even though it was the first vintage, the winemaking prowess really shines in this wine and it drinks like a wine that has been a staple in the Willamette Valley for years.
